I'm sure you have noticed that there are a lot of dirt roads in Three Rivers and a lot of dust, per photo above. Those neighbors living along these roads are inundated with the road dust caused by cars and trucks, speeding up and down our by-ways. Folks walking along the road, riding their bicycles, golf carts, carrying tubes, or picnicking in Hodor Park are *eating your dust* – literally!

Riverside Avenue has two speed limits – 15 mph from US 27 to Nebraska Avenue. From Nebraska to Santa Fe Drive it's 25 mph. Truthfully, in dry weather, anything faster creates giant clouds of dust, choking anyone who happens to be within eyeshot of the road.

This year we have prevailed upon the Sheriff's Department to issue tickets to speeders. It could cost you \$150.00 or more, plus points on your Driver's license. Is it worth it to get there 5 seconds faster?
