- 9. Park Managers Report, Bill Brim: provided a detail report, please refer to Web site attachments. In general, the majority of people are very appreciative of what we're doing at the parks. There are still some groups that are not. He's been working with the Sheriff on some issues. Gate locking is still a problem; folks coming up to Point Park; dogs without leashes; glass containers at all the parks, especially at Point Park. Midpoint someone left gate open, others got in without a key and we're asked to leave; a gentleman a group of four, a group of 3 with a dog, Steel, had a dog in there, said it wasn't his, but it was, he got in to Bill's face. B.Brim left, locked the gate and wrote an incident report as is his habit. Camping Park, gate is always left open! 2 Airboats pulled up on the shore with ropes around the trees. Speeding by 4 wheelers is also a problem! He noted it's great to work with a team of people. *Chairman then spoke...the more documentation we get we can use to warn, and eventually take away memberships. If we don't work to enforce rules in place, we will get sued (in fact we are currently in a difficult suit).
- *T. Tramel noted it's an educational process. He would support sending Mr. Steele a letter based on these current incidents, where he almost ran over a person.
- *Chairman notes we have now identified a green and black (4) wheeler. We could send our findings to State Attorney's office and Sheriffs department.
- *T. Tramel Motion that we send a notice to Mr Steele (a member), 2nd by C. Thompson. Discussion... *B.Martin notes that we need to have evidence along with the letter. Motion passes unanimously.

12. Election's Committee Report, Vonda Ackerson

13. Maintenance Committee Report, J.Bryant

Spoke to Jason Welding about constructing grills; he may be a bit more expensive than the grills we've found, but those would require an additional \$130.00 for shipping.

14. Communication's Committee Report, Vonda Ackerson:

Rumor control:

1) Post put on FB page about how we're not using that area at Boat ramp park, usage is too much conflict, and in the wetlands.

2) down on the Santa Fe, there are 5th wheelers, someone is spreading rumors about Vonda Ackerson running an Airbnb on one of her lots, this is untrue. She does not and has never had Air BnB. The property they're accusing her of is adjacent to hers.

Camera Security Update, Charlee Thompson:

- *All conduits are in at Midpoint, the base of the pole has been concreted in, waiting for everything to dry. He had to order a different type of cable that can be underwater when it floods.
- *Based on the issues B.Brim faces, Recommends purchasing a body cam for B.Brim (like the sheriffs use in the \$200-\$300 range). Motion to approve by T.Tramel 2nd R.Palm, passed unanimously.
- *Chairman notes that at Midpoint we are having lots of problems with our gates, and the cameras will capture who comes in and who locks, etc.
- *C. Thompson noted that the recorder is not near the camera, so if someone tampers with it that will have been recorded and we will have plenty of footage to turn into the sheriff's office.
- *a badge with photo of B. Brim was also approved.

15. New Business:

- *Picnic planning has begun
- *H. Gilchrist requested the Springs Protection Zone be put on the agenda
- *Bring ideas to the Member's meeting on Oct. 8th to share with everyone, this includes new rules, etc.

16. Old Business:

- *Protection of swimming area was brought up; Chairman noted this issue is being addressed and we are working on possible solutions.
- *J. Crane questioned why there is not another position open since he thinks C.Arnett was part of the B team. V. Ackerson has done the research, Charlie Arnett was on the ballot 2 years ago, he received 143 votes

17. Open Property Comments to the Board Time limit of 2 minutes per person).

- *Ray ______, a19 year resident who has pretty much stopped going to the parks except at night when he kayak's wanted reassurance that dogs are allowed on the river, and seemed satisfied to know that Fishing Park and Camping Park are Dog friendly. He said he was willing to help set up with doggie bags and everything.
- *Some reasons we don't allow dogs in other more popular parks: Infantigo which is caused by animal feces, kids coming up to dogs that don't bite, but they do bite.
- *T. Tramel suggests we consider separate launch and exit areas for those with dogs.
- *Susan Johnson, based on activity on July 4th, and knowing that Labor Day is coming up, she suggests Sherriff's come later and stay later, Vonda and Charlee agreed.
- *Limerock that's been placed in walkway is hard on feet and people are using grass instead.
